Have you seen the huge medical and residential complex being planned for Potrero Hill?

What It Is

- A medical office and residential complex to replace the Cor-O-Van facility (Mississippi Street between 16th and 17th)
- 84' high, block-wide structure that ridicules the 68' height limit for this zone and dwarfs the 45' freeway overpass
- 700,000 square feet of total floor space
- Three-story underground garage with high-turnover paid parking for 700+ cars accessed only via the already-very-busy Mississippi Street
- Over 120 new residential units with dedicated parking spaces for only 65% of them

Why It's Bad

- Overwhelms the architectural scale and character of the surrounding area and brings Mission-Bay-style development into Potrero Hill
- Burdens the busiest streets of the Hill with too much traffic and parking congestion
- Abuses city zoning and historic preservation processes
- Destroys buildings significant to the history of steel manufacturing in California
- Walls off a big chunk of Potrero Hill from the downtown area and vice versa
- Threatens numerous local small businesses
- Sets dangerous precedent for future development
- Ignores Potrero Hill Community Plan negotiated with the neighborhood over more than a decade
